WorldSkills Abu Dhabi 2017 is being held under the patronage of His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi and Deputy Supreme Commander of the UAE Armed Forces. Approximately 1,300 Competitors from the 77 Member countries of WorldSkills International will compete in 51 skill competitions – from Aircraft Maintenance and Robotics to Fashion Technology and Graphic Design.

WorldSkills Abu Dhabi 2017 aims to inspire young people to study vocational skills for entrepreneurship or for their career, in line with the economic diversification objectives of the Abu Dhabi Economic Vision 2030.

The event will take place 15-18 October 2017 at the Abu Dhabi National Exhibition Centre (ADNEC), with the Opening Ceremony on 14 October, and the Closing Ceremony on 19 October (both at the du Arena on Yas Island).





Visitors will be able to play "Skill It", an exciting new mobile app at WorldSkills Abu Dhabi 2017. Visitors are encouraged to start their own business, try different skill challenges at the event, and collect points to help their business rise to the top and win prizes.



EVENT ACCESS

The 51 skills are staged across ADNEC. Skills are mostly grouped within the six sectors: Construction and Building, Creative Arts and Fashion, Information and Communication Technology, Manufacturing and Engineering Technology, Social and Personal Services, and Transportation and Logistics.

Media are invited to walk around to view and photograph any of the 51 skill competitions from the outer perimeter of each area. However, media may not interfere with the Competition in any way, this includes speaking to the Competitors or making any interview or photo requests. Such requests will need to be made formally through the media centre or through the Competitor's Member Organization.

TRANSPORTATION

ADNEC is one of the most accessible venues from across the world. It is just a 20-minute drive away from Abu Dhabi International Airport, and is located near the heart of Abu Dhabi.

Members of the media will have free and dedicated parking spots in car park lot A at ADNEC provided they have their WorldSkills Abu Dhabi 2017 accreditation. From the car park, media can follow the signs toward the media centre located at the wedding hall near the Aloft hotel.

Media who have purchased travel packages with WorldSkills Abu Dhabi 2017 and are staying at one of the official hotels can use the shuttle buses from the hotel to ADNEC.



INTERVIEWING COMPETITORS

To ensure the integrity of the Competition and the Competitors' experience, WorldSkills has established strict guidelines for members of the media who wish to interview a Competitor. No members of the media can make direct contact with any Competitor, without going through the Member Organization. In the first instance members of the media must contact the appropriate Team Leader to request an interview with a Competitor.

All Team Leaders will have a local mobile number and email address, and their contact information will be available at the media centre help desk.

ONE SCHOOL ONE COUNTRY

One School One Country is a school partnership programme that has accompanied each WorldSkills Competition since 2007 in Shizuoka, Japan. Since its inaugural year, the school programme has brought thousands of students from different age groups closer to the world of skills. Abu Dhabi will host the 6th edition of One School One Country, pairing approximately 60 international teams with Abu Dhabi schools in a cross-cultural experience that opens the doors of friendship and raises awareness of the importance and value of a vocational education.

In collaboration with the Abu Dhabi Education Council (ADEC), One School One Country familiarizes young students from 9 to 12 years with skills that are taught in Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) while discovering and embracing the cultures of other countries. On 12 October, shortly before the official opening of WorldSkills Abu Dhabi 2017, each Member Delegation will visit their partnered school for a programme of informal activities and cultural presentations.



INTERNATIONAL TVETYOUTH FORUM

Abu Dhabi Centre for Technical and Vocational Education and Training (ACTVET) will launch the first International TVET Youth Forum on 14-15 October. Up to 300 young people will come together in Abu Dhabi to discuss the future of Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET). They will participate in several think tanks, with topics ranging from Innovation, Industry 4.0, Entrepreneurship, Green Economy, Global Citizenship, Happiness, and Tolerance.

Prior to the event, these young people will participate in online forums and engage on social media. During the whole process they will be supported by a group of dedicated experts and professional facilitators. In addition, they will carry out research, generate ideas and discuss different opinions. The result will be a Youth Declaration, which aims to inspire all those attending WorldSkills Abu Dhabi 2017, but also to set the agenda for future events.

WORLDSKILLS CONFERENCE

The WorldSkills Conference is where leading figures from industry, governments, international organizations and academia help shape the global skills agenda. The two-day programme allows for debate and networking with global leaders from the TVET sector. The conference is accompanied by a Ministerial Summit — to which national ministers of education, skills, industry, and business have been invited

PRESS CODE OF CONDUCT

WorldSkills openly encourages and promotes all aspects of the WorldSkills Competition, especially Competition press coverage. The following code of conduct outlines the expected partnership the press have with WorldSkills. For the purpose of this Code of Conduct – "Press" includes reporters, journalists, photographers, and film crews.

- All press attending the WorldSkills Competition need to be accredited and ensure that their press badge is visible at all times. All press are also subject to the WorldSkills Code of Ethics and the Competition Rules. In particular, B.12 Issue and Dispute Resolution and B.10 Filming and photographing at the Competition. Code of Conduct Competitor access and Workshop Access
- No photographing or filming of a Competitor should take place that may interfere with or hinder the performance of the Competitor in the Competition.
- Press may take photos and film from outside the workshop without any prior approval. Note: accreditation badges must be visible at all times. If a person is acting suspiciously then they may be questioned by an Expert in this case, they are requested to comply fully with the Expert questions and requests.
- No press can enter a workshop during the Competition.
- No press can enter a workshop during breaks in the Competition without the permission of the Chief Expert or Press Contact for that skill competition. Specific 'shots' or 'angles' are to be organized in discussion with the Chief Expert or Press Contact for that skill, the compatriot Expert, and the Competitor.
- No press can communicate with a Competitor without the permission of the Chief Expert or Press Contact for that skill and the compatriot Expert.
- No press is to enter the 'personal work space' (i.e. do 'close-ups') of a Competitor without the permission of the Chief Expert or Press Contact for that skill and the compatriot Expert.

Competitor Access Outside Workshop

Any interviews with Competitors must be organized and approved via the relevant Team Leader and the appointed Communications Officer for the Member organization. Any Press who do not comply with this are at risk of having their accreditation revoked.

LOCAL AND HOST CITY INFO

Abu Dhabi is the capital city of the United Arab Emirates and is one of seven Emirates that make up the UAE. It is situated along the Arabian Gulf and spans several islands, while the rest of the emirate stretches hundreds of kilometres inland and further along the coast.

A modern and fast-growing city, Abu Dhabi is an ideal choice as the first in the MENA region to host a WorldSkills Competition. This event serves as a powerful statement about the growth of WorldSkills, and the importance of vocational skills and education for the global economy.

Abu Dhabi boasts an excellent infrastructure and service network, premier hotels and restaurants, some of the biggest names in entertainment, and a vibrant and fascinating culture that will ensure a memorable visit for all those who take part and visit.



GETTING AROUND

Silver taxis are the most popular form of transport and are plentiful and inexpensive. You can hail taxis on the street, or by calling the TransAD booking line at 600 53 53 53 or the TransAD app. Fares are always metered.

Renting a car is easy and inexpensive. There are many car rental companies at Abu Dhabi airport and around the city, including Budget, Thrifty, Hertz, and Europear. Some nationalities may be required to produce an international driving license as well as their regular driving license, so check with the company first. A valid credit card is needed, and a copy of your passport photograph page will be made. Roads in Abu Dhabi are modern and well maintained, with signs in both Arabic and English. Driving is on the right side of the road.

Abu Dhabi has a series of bus routes which cover most of the city, with timetables available on the Department of Transport website.

Pedestrians should always observe the "walking man" signs at crossings and use the bridges and underpasses on major roads when available. It is not the custom for vehicles to stop for pedestrians on crossings without lights, so always wait for a sufficient gap in traffic before stepping out.

LANGUAGE

Arabic is the official language of the UAE. English is the second language, and you will find everything you need is almost always in both languages. English is also widely spoken but if you try to learn a few Arabic words and phrases it will be much appreciated. It has been estimated that around 200 different nationalities live and work in the UAE, so you will almost certainly find someone who shares your language.

MONEY

The currency of the UAE is the dirham, which is pegged to the United States dollar at the rate of Dh3.67 to \$1. The highest coin is Dh1, with smaller coins for half and a quarter, in units known as fils.

Bank notes come in Dh5, Dh10, Dh20, Dh50, Dh100, Dh200 and Dh500. A Dh1,000 note exists but is not widely used for ordinary transactions. Please note that shopkeepers and taxi drivers may have problems giving change for any bank note above Dh100.

International withdrawals can be made at cash machines/ATMs that are found at banks, larger hotels and shopping malls. Currency exchanges can be found at the airport and in most shopping malls and will generally offer a better rate of exchange than banks, especially for larger amounts.

Tipping in the UAE is optional but appreciated. You will find a service charge already added to your bill in hotels and hotel restaurants, but this often is not given to the restaurant staff. For taxis and restaurant staff, around 10 per cent is sufficient but no offence will be taken if you do not tip

STAY CONNECTED

The international code for the UAE is 971, followed by the number, but dropping the first digit. As a guide, mobile phone numbers begin with 05, while Abu Dhabi is 02 and Dubai is 04.

Etisalat sells special SIM cards for visitors which can be purchased at their airport shops or in outlets at the bigger shopping malls. You will need to show your passport when purchasing. Etisalat will have kiosks throughout ADNEC offering special rates during WorldSkills Abu Dhabi 2017.

Most hotels offer free internet for guests, as do shopping malls with simple registration via email or SMS.

The UAE operates a 220 – 240 volt electrical system with three flat pin plugs inherited from Britain.

CULTURAL DO'S AND DON'TS

Dress code is not legally enforced, so observing it is just a matter of simple courtesy to your hosts. It is generally appreciated if women wear skirts that are no more than a couple of inches above the knee, and tops covering the shoulders. Men should also keep their shoulders covered and wear shorts that come to the knee. Tattoos are best kept covered in public places.

Alcohol is forbidden to Muslims as part of their religion, but the UAE permits it for non-Muslims. Alcohol is sold in hotel bars and restaurants but not in other venues, with a few exceptions. Permanent residents may purchase alcohol from specialist shops but require a special license which is not available to visitors. You must be 21 and older to drink and it is a good idea for younger visitors to carry proof of age even if they are legally allowed alcohol.

Using illegal drugs in the UAE, bringing them into the country, and buying and selling them will all have extremely serious consequences.

Using offensive gestures and hand signals to other drivers is to be avoided and may result in a complaint to the police and possible prosecution.

Couples are not expected to be physically demonstrative in public, but holding hands is acceptable. In general, all public signs of affection should be avoided.

The vast majority of the meat in the UAE is halal, meaning the animals have been slaughtered according to Islamic teaching. Most restaurants have vegetarian and fish options.

Pork is considered haram—or forbidden—for Muslims according to the teachings of the Quran, which says the pig is forbidden. Pork products, which can include foods made with gelatine, are sold in some supermarkets, in special areas clearly marked for non-Muslims.



SHEIKH ZAYED GRAND MOSQUE

The vision of the Late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan is perhaps the most visited attraction in Abu Dhabi, and with good reason too. Walk around the massive grounds to marvel at 82 marble domes, 1,000 pillars, more than 100,000 tons of pure white marble. In all, it accommodates more than 40,000 worshippers. WorldSkills Abu Dhabi 2017 offers free mosque tours for all accredited media. More details at the media help desk.

CORNICHE BEACH

Centrally located, the Corniche Beach offers white sand shores and postcard views of the downtown skyline and the Marina Breakwater. Parts of the beach are free to enter public beaches, while another section is dedicated family beach. Al Sahil beach is paid. Ride or stroll along the beach path or play a game of basketball or volleyball on one of the courts. There are several food and beverage options, plus a host of services including change rooms, bathrooms, ATMs, and prayer rooms.



UMM AL EMARAT PARK

One of the most popular green spaces in Abu Dhabi, Umm Al Emarat Park is a 15-hectare serene escape of the city. Formerly called Mushrif Central Park, it underwent two years of redevelopment and re-opened in March 2015. The rejuvenated park includes an amphitheatre, animal barn, botanic garden, shade house, and the sprawling Great Lawn. The park is open daily from 8am to midnight and costs 5 AED to enter. SAADIYAT PUBLIC BEACH

Tucked away in the north corner of Abu Dhabi, Saadiyat Public Beach features crystal blue water and white sandy shores. You can windsurf or sail, take yoga classes, or kick back on one of the sun loungers. There are a host of amenities including umbrellas, change rooms, lockers, showers, and parking.

FERRARI WORLD

Under its unmistakable red roof, which was designed to mimic the side profile of the Ferrari GT, Ferrari World features more than 20 rides and attractions in a sprawling 200,000 square metre facility on Yas Island. It boasts advanced racing simulators and the world's fastest roller coaster, the Formula Rossa, which hits a soaring top speed of 240 km/h. YAS WATERWORLD

The only Emirati-themed waterpark in the world is inspired by the UAE's rich heritage of pearl diving through its unique story of 'The Legend of the Lost Pearl'. The UAE's first mega waterpark is home to 45 exhilarating rides, slides and attractions – five of which can be found nowhere else in the world. With rides and experiences to thrill the young and the young at heart, the waterpark plays host to Dawwama – the world's first hydro-magnetic tornado waterslide, as well as the globe's first interactive water and laser rollercoaster, Bandit Bomber.

YAS MARINA CIRCUIT

Based on Yas Island, Yas Marina Circuit is considered one of the most technologically-advanced Formula 1 circuits in the world and a home for motorsports in the Middle East. It is the site of the annual F1 race and other motoring events. On Tuesday evenings, you can work out on F1 track. Whether you're a serious runner, a keen cyclist, or simply wanting to take a sunset stroll with the family, participants of all fitness levels and speeds are welcome on the track.



MANARAT AL SAADIYAT

Meaning 'The Place of Enlightenment', Manarat Al Saadiyat is an artistic venue of four galleries, a 250-seat theatre, and restaurant.

It's also the foundation for Abu Dhabi's cultural epicentre, with hotly anticipated openings of the Louvre Abu Dhabi, Zayed National Museum, and the Frank Gehry designed Guggenheim Abu Dhabi. Manarat Al Saadiyat is home to a multimedia exhibit that explains the ambitious vision of the island's development. Admission is free. EASTERN MANGROVES

Abu Dhabi's coastal areas are richly lined with mangrove forests with an estimated 70 square kilometres of forest across the Emirate. The Mangrove National Park has more than 19 square kilometres of forest and is a dense, luxuriant concentration of mangrove trees, protected by government order. This is a real haven for nature lovers, outdoor enthusiasts and bird lovers, or simply people who want to spend some time away from the hustle and bustle of the city. Along the promenade are restaurants, cafes, as well as kayak and boat rentals.
